## Building a Community-Wide Campaign for Foundational Learning

In the final year of the RISE programme, the RISE Directorate is planning a united, community-wide advocacy campaign aimed at improving learning in schools globally. In our last meeting (part one), we mapped some of the key audiences critical to improving outcomes. In this workshop (part two) we hope to convene organisations across our community to talk over plans for launching a global campaign focused on the importance of foundational learning. The proposed goals of this campaign would be to:

- Focus global and national conversations on the learning crisis, and the need to improve learning for all children
- Unite behind the need to prioritise and strengthen foundational learning as the first step

During this meeting we will focus on plans for in-country activities to help achieve the above goals. We will be offering small grants (£1000-£3000) to support in-country activities during the campaign period – more information on how to access these grants will be given during the meeting.
